Brown began his career as a Youth Program Director with Recreation and Parks. He later served as an elementary educator and crisis interventionist in Baltimore County. These experiences shaped his commitment to youth, community, and service.

Today, Brown serves as Program Director of the National Center on Institutions and Alternatives Vocational Training Center in Baltimore. He leads workforce development programs that connect individuals facing employment barriers with sustainable careers. The VTC provides industry recognized training in Automotive Repair, HVAC/R, and Commercial Driver's License Class B. Participants also receive case management, employment services, financial education, and other support. Brown's leadership focuses on creating pathways to economic mobility, stability, and generational wealth.

In recognition of his leadership and community impact, Brown was named a 2026 Baltimore Banner Emerging Leader.

Brown's commitment to young people also extends to athletics. He serves as Director of Operations for St. Frances Academy Boys Basketball and Team Melo, the nationally recognized grassroots basketball program associated with Baltimore native and NBA legend Carmelo Anthony. Through these roles, he helps create opportunities for young athletes to develop on and off the court.

Brown's leadership is grounded in a simple principle: "Success happens when preparation meets opportunity, and I believe in being a catalyst for both."
